Serving homeless women from Wake County, ages 18 and older. Offers overnight shelter, 3-5 day non-medical detox center, 7-12 month long-term recovery program. Pregnant women may stay in the overnight shelter but are not admitted to detox or the recovery program. Walk-ups are not allowed and beds are not reserved. In order to enter the emergency night shelter, women must be at the Women's Center by 3:15 pm each day for the van pick-up.
